Please cut grapes and tomatoes lengthwise in half if sending in packed lunches.

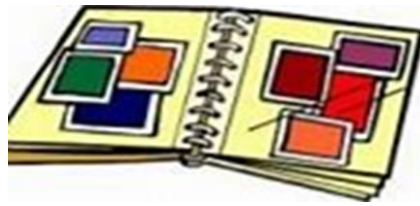


Drinks are provided at nursery, so you do not need to include them in their packed lunch.
